However, the cricket club occupied the storeroom by arrangement directly with the Vale Council without any input with the community council. It was agreed that this was not a matter for the community council. Action Clerk to inform the Vale that we consider the arrangements with the cricket club were not a matter for the community council and that we still hoped the agreed work would be carried out.
